

I've spent 6 years in a civil suit over the taking of my life estate. I've filed numerous ethics complaints against a attorney, and two judges.

I was refused about seven times altogether, to have a judge who was not violating conflict laws in being on my case. There was personal friendship with one, and also she had been the oppositions attorney before becoming a judge.

The other judge I knew his son, a third party relationship. He also tried to get me to pay him money. And worse..that part I turned in to FBI.

They did not even give me a hearing required by law.

Ties are already established. The best action is to keep it revolving so it limits their previous relationship influence.

This extension is a very bad idea. Keeping it moving with new people fresh is important. I can think of no reason to extend it. Only if you want bias
