Financial aid programs like sports lottery matter to me because without them my teammates and I wouldn't be able to fully embrace or participate in what we love. While I'm not just an athlete, running and competing are my therapy. They are my go-to for bigger life challenges. They are my connection to a wonderful, passionate community. A community that strives to set an example of equity, teamwork, and pride for the larger community of Portland. Not only is my athletic department working to provide support for our community, so are the student athletes themselves. Through our Student Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC), we have created conversations around diversity, inclusion, mental health, and community service. This whole last year has shown me just how much my sport supports the rest of my endeavors.
