Dear Committee Chair Nathanson and members of the Committee:

I am submitting testimony in support of HB2357 because I strongly believe that the Oregon Forest Resources Institute does not represent my views or the views of most other Oregonians I know. I feel that they are a very pro timber marketing oriented mouthpiece for the timber industry that uses our state's trees as a cash crop for special interests. Our forests are a complex ecosystem that sustains our wildlife and sequesters vast amounts of carbon.
