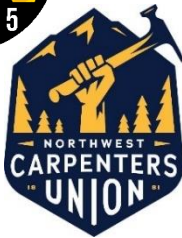

Yes on Senate Bill 420A and the A3 Amendment: Support Local Oregon Workforce & Business

Senate Bill 420 will help local contracting agencies and contract review boards around the state develop and implement community benefit contracts that help ensure their public construction projects holistically benefit their communities.

SB 420 allows local contracting agencies and local contract review boards to voluntarily develop and adopt community benefit contracts with requirements for contractors bidding on public construction projects. The A3 amendments allow further flexibility in how a local contract review board/contracting agency approaches these agreements by making the provisions from the bill optional.

Should a local contract review board or contracting agency decide to adopt the community benefit contract model, there are certain optional provisions that can be considered as a starting point, in addition to any other items that are beneficial to the community:

- Qualification as a Registered Training Agent with BOLI.
- Providing family healthcare to workers on the project.
- Employment of registered apprentices at a percentage determined in developing the contract.

The community benefit contract model is an optional economic and workforce development tool for local governments that will:

- ✓ Create opportunities to advance economic equity for BIPOC workers and contractors.
- ✓ Support local contractors in providing good jobs and benefits to workers in the community.
- ✓ Support the training and development of a skilled and diverse workforce via state registered training agents for apprentices.
- ✓ Allow for development of local standards that meet the specific needs of communities and prioritizes local economies around Oregon.

Senate Bill 420 will help support responsible public construction, workforce standards, and economic development while accounting for the differing needs in Oregon communities.
