Willamette Deserves Science, Not Special Interest Speculation.

Thank you for your time and I am against SB 857.

As a homeowner on the Willamette River for the past 9 years, it is alarming to see special interest groups converting the river into a "country club" purely dedicated their activities, excluding other groups without validated research specific to the Willamette River. Equally egregious are a select group of greedy river homeowners that are working with these special interest groups to further privatize and expand their backyard real estate, removing boats and families having fun and exercise on the river.
