Re: SB 562 Letter of Information

Introduction:

The Oregon Department of Human Services (ODHS) is writing to provide information regarding the proposed changes in SB 562.

Background:

The ODHS Child Welfare Division currently has age requirements for certification to become a foster parent. For certification an individual is required to be 21 years of age, unless there is a tribal or relative relationship where an exception can be granted for those between the ages of 18-21.

What this bill does:

SB 562 codifies existing federal and state statute, rules, policies and practice, prohibiting individuals from providing child welfare services based on certain characteristics. The bill also codifies state policy on preventing retaliation when individuals report adverse experiences within the child welfare system.

SB 562 creates an unintended consequence resulting in the removal of age requirements to become a certified foster parent.

Summary:

ODHS respectfully submits this information for consideration on age requirements for foster parent certification.
