

The Oregon Constitution

Article 1 - Bill of Rights

Section 27. Right to bear arms; military subordinate to civil power. The people shall have the right to bear arms for the defence [sic] of themselves, and the State, but the Military shall be kept in strict subordination to the civil power[.]

You are attempting to grant a power, adopt an ordinance, that you do not have. Further you seem to be granting a power that does not exist, raising a policy to have effect of law.

If you are concerned about and trying to improve gun safety, then you should concentrate on that rather than trying to "get around" the Oregon Constitution.
