

In McMinnville, Oregon, on Third Street, there is a diner called "Morning Thunder". They share an inside courtyard with several other businesses, of which this courtyard has fans in the roof to allow for ventilation. He bought a tent, like other restaurants, put it outside on the street and it takes up three parking spaces. These types of tents are enclosed with little air flow through them.
