Good afternoon Chair and members of the committee, my name is Rae Blackbird. I'm a Senior at Madison High School in Portland Oregon and an Our Climate Fellow for the 2021 Legislative session, and today I'm speaking on behalf of SMJ5-1 and urging you to take bold, bipartisan climate action.

In the past six months, our state has been hit by devastating forest fires that filled the air with ash and toxic smoke, Just two weeks ago freezing snow and ice left thousands of Oregonians without power and internet access. These events show us how precarious of a situation we're in as a state, country, and planet. You've heard it before, and I'm here saying it again, we're running out of time to fight for a livable climate.
