This term, the cost of attendance at PSU has put a massive financial strain on my family since both me and my brother are currently enrolled in college.

I am trying to be financially responsible and carefully budget so I can finish my degree. However, because the cost of textbooks is too high, I rarely buy the textbooks I need for my courses. I have always tried my best to somehow get through classes without a textbook. For some classes, textbooks are a required part of the course and utilizing a textbook for most courses can be extremely beneficial toward your success. As a biology student, it makes it more difficult to understand dense and concept-heavy material while relying solely on class lectures without the help of textbooks.

Right now, because we do not have HB 2919 in place, that is simply not enough to do well in class, but I have no other option. I believe that access to textbook and fee price amounts at the time of course registration can help me better plan for my academic term. That way, I can decide when and where to allocate more hours at work to make sure I have enough money set aside to pay for textbooks while having some money leftover for other college-related expenses.
