Oregon Small Businesses Support Right to Repair (HB 2698)

Consumer electronics like smartphones, laptops, tablets have come to play integral roles in our lives. Unfortunately, the more indispensable they've become, the more they have filled up our landfills. In fact, according to a 2013 report from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, it is estimated that 4,800 phones are thrown out every day in Oregon.

One of the factors contributing to this problem is the fact that manufacturers make it difficult and overly expensive for consumers to repair their own products. For instance, Apple launched a new software update in 2017 that caused phones with older batteries to slow down drastically. The problem could be fixed by changing the batteries, but since apple had the exclusive rights to replace iPhone batteries, they became so backlogged with service requests that many consumers were forced to wait months for a new battery.

Unsurprisingly, this and other examples have driven consumer interest in fixing their own devices. For example, shortly after the Apple battery problem became apparent, 3,048 Oregon consumers visited the self-repair website i-Fixit; a 179% increase in traffic. In this case, Right to Repair legislation would give consumers the option of replacing the battery themselves or taking their phone to a third party repair shop.

Consumers and independent repair shops should have the right to repair devices and have access to the same manuals, tools, and parts that manufacturers do. Consumers deserve low-cost options to extend the lifespan of their electronic device.

Releasing this information would not only benefit consumers and repair shops, but would also allow for the responsible recycling of devices that are nearly impossible to take apart without certain manuals and tools.

Right to Repair protects consumers from exorbitant, uncompetitive costs; empowers people to fix their own devices; and contributes to efforts to reduce waste.

We urge you to support Right to Repair in order to protect consumers and reduce the flow of trash into our landfills.
