HB 4008 A

Authorizes Commission on Statewide Law Enforcement Standards of Conduct and Discipline to hire executive director and support staff, and to enter into interagency or intergovernmental agreement for provision of support staff.

HB 4016 A

Authorizes Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission to, based on supply of and demand for marijuana, refuse to issue initial marijuana production, processing, wholesale and retail licenses for amount of time commission determines necessary.

HB 4138 A

Amends provisions of workers' compensation law related to authorization of temporary disability, claim closure and overpayments of compensation.

HB 4050 A

Directs Department of Corrections, in cooperation with Oregon Criminal Justice Commission, to establish pilot program to provide legal services that assist adults in custody who are serving sentences at Coffee Creek Correctional Facility.

HB 4144 A

Allows identified election worker to have residence address exempted from disclosure as public record by county clerk.
