SUMMARY

Recognizes and honors Sergeant John Noble Holcomb (1946-1968) for his service to his country.

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2	Whereas Sergeant John Noble Holcomb was born on June 11, 1946, in
3	Baker City, Oregon, the seat of Baker County; and
4	Whereas Sergeant Holcomb attended elementary schools in Baker County
5	and was a 1964 graduate of Eagle Valley High School in Richland, Oregon;
6	and
7	Whereas Sergeant Holcomb enlisted in the United States Army in
8	Corvallis, Oregon, in 1966; and
9	Whereas Sergeant Holcomb began his tour of duty in Vietnam on March
10	23, 1968; and
11	Whereas Sergeant Holcomb was assigned to Company D, 2nd Battalion,
12	7th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Cavalry Division; and
13	Whereas during an enemy attack on December 3, 1968, near Quan Loi
14	Base Camp, Binh Long Province, Republic of Vietnam, during Operation
15	Sheridan Sabre, Sergeant Holcomb led his squad in the defense of their po-
16	sition; and
17	Whereas Sergeant Holcomb, with complete disregard for heavy enemy fire,
18	moved among his men, giving encouragement and directing fire on the as-
19	saulting enemy; and
20	Whereas when their machine gunner was wounded, Sergeant Holcomb
21	seized the weapon and ran to a forward edge of their position and placed

- 1 withering fire on the enemy; and
- Whereas Sergeant Holcomb's gallant actions caused the enemy to with-
- 3 draw, and Sergeant Holcomb treated the wounded and carried them to a po-
- 4 sition of safety before reorganizing his defensive sector, despite a raging
- 5 grass fire ignited by incoming mortar and rocket rounds; and
- Whereas the enemy assaulted the position a second time and Sergeant
- 7 Holcomb again manned the forward machine gun, devastating the enemy at-
- 8 tack and forcing the enemy to again break contact and withdraw; and
- 9 Whereas Sergeant Holcomb's position was hit by an enemy rocket, de-
- 10 stroying his machine gun and severely wounding him; and
- 11 Whereas despite his painful wounds, Sergeant Holcomb crawled through
- 12 the grass fire and exploding mortar and rocket rounds to move the members
- of his squad, each of whom had been wounded, to more secure positions; and
- Whereas Sergeant Holcomb was the last surviving leader of his platoon,
- and he organized his men to repel the enemy; and
- Whereas Sergeant Holcomb crawled to the platoon radio and reported the
- 17 third enemy assault on his position, which brought friendly supporting fire
- 18 to bear on the charging enemy and broke up the enemy attack; and
- 19 Whereas Sergeant Holcomb perished from his wounds later that day; and
- Whereas in 1971, Sergeant Holcomb was posthumously awarded the Medal
- 21 of Honor, the nation's highest decoration for valor in combat; and
- 22 Whereas Sergeant Holcomb was also awarded the Bronze Star Medal with
- 23 "V" device and oak leaf cluster, Army Commendation Medal with "V" device,
- 24 Air Medal with oak leaf cluster, Purple Heart, Combat Infantryman Badge
- 25 and Vietnam Service Medal; and
- 26 Whereas Sergeant Holcomb was buried at Eagle Valley Cemetery in
- 27 Richland and he is honored on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial; and
- 28 Whereas Sergeant Holcomb was an outstanding leader who served his
- 29 country with honor, distinction and selfless devotion to duty; now, therefore,
- 30 Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
- That we, the members of the Eighty-first Legislative Assembly, recognize
