The Governor has appointed the following individuals to the Commission on Black Affairs subject to Senate confirmation.¹

Statement of Economic Interest²

Not required.

Statutory Requirements³

The commission is comprised of 11 members:⁴

- one senator appointed by the President of the Senate (MANNING);
- one representative appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives (SPENCE); and
- nine members appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate (ADDAE, BOOKER, DOGO, DUNCAN, FARLEY, FOUTHER-BRANCH, GARY-SMITH, PRICE, SIMMS).

All members must be Oregon residents. Gubernatorial appointees serve four-year terms; legislators serve two-year terms. Commission members must elect a chairperson and vice chairperson. A majority of members constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. Appointments must be made to ensure representation of black persons in Oregon.

Duties and Authority

The commission was created to work for the implementation and establishment of economic, social, legal, and political equality for black persons in Oregon.⁵

The commission must:6

- monitor existing programs and legislation designed to meet the needs of Oregon's black population;
- identify and research problem areas and issues affecting the black community and recommend actions to the Governor and the Legislative Assembly, including recommendations on legislative programs;
- maintain a liaison between the black community and government entities;
- encourage black representation on state boards and commissions; and
- meet at least annually in a joint meeting with other commissions to consider and act upon issues of mutual importance.
