#### WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Establishes Racial Equity and Justice Youth Collaborative. Appropriates unspecified moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Education (ODE) for implementation of collaborative. Prescribes eligibility requirements and process for members of collaborative to be appointed by Governor. Requires ODE to provide youth members with peer support and resources to ensure successful participation. Prescribes duties of collaborative and requires ODE to provide staff support. Directs ODE and partner agencies to establish a work group that will develop standards and recruitment process for selecting members of collaborative by October 31, 2022. Directs Governor, in consultation with the work group, to appoint collaborative members by February 15, 2023. Takes effect July 1, 2022.

#### BACKGROUND:

In the summer of 2020, a meeting between students of color and Oregon school and district administrators was disrupted by an intruder. As a result of the disruption, a coalition of stakeholder organizations worked to develop an initiative to promote youth engagement and participation in the policymaking process that would be responsive to student concerns. That process led to the introduction of House Bill 3363 A (not enacted) in the 2021 legislative session, which would have established the Racial Equity and Justice Youth Collaborative, a body consisting primarily of students from underrepresented backgrounds that would advise state agencies on issues relating to racial equity.

House Bill 4099 establishes the Racial Equity and Justice Youth Collaborative and outlines its responsibilities and membership.
