SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs University of Oregon to conduct study on prevalence of child abuse in this state and to submit report regarding study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to human services. Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Higher Education Coordinating Commission for study and report.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the prevalence of child abuse in Oregon.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. The University of Oregon shall conduct a study on the prevalence of child**
5 **abuse in this state. The university shall submit a report on the study, in the manner pro-**
6 **vided by ORS 192.245, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to hu-**
7 **man services no later than September 15, 2023.**

8 **SECTION 2. (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-**
9 **propriated to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for the biennium ending June 30,**
10 **2023, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$700,000, for the purposes specified in section**
11 **1 of this 2022 Act.**

12 **(2) Moneys distributed by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for the Uni-**
13 **versity of Oregon's duties under section 1 of this 2022 Act may not be used to pay the uni-**
14 **versity for facilities and administrative costs not directly related to the Oregon child abuse**
15 **prevalence study and report described in section 1 of this 2022 Act.**

16 **SECTION 3. Sections 1 and 2 of this 2022 Act are repealed on January 2, 2024.**
