

SENATE MINORITY REPORT AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 1512

By Nonconcurring Members of COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT
MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the semicolon delete the rest of the line and line 3
2 and insert “and prescribing an effective date.”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 23 and delete pages 2 through 9 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Occupational and Professional Licensing is estab-**
5 **lished.**

6 **“(2) The task force consists of 21 members appointed as follows:**

7 **“(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint:**

8 **“(A) Two members from among members of the Senate, with one member from each of**
9 **the two largest caucuses among members of the Senate;**

10 **“(B) One member who represents employers who hire persons who require licenses to**
11 **pursue an occupation or profession; and**

12 **“(C) One member who is a person who is working in a field that requires an occupational**
13 **or professional license.**

14 **“(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint:**

15 **“(A) Two members from among members of the House of Representatives, with one**
16 **member from each of the two largest caucuses among members of the House of Represen-**
17 **tatives;**

18 **“(B) One member who represents employers who hire persons who require licenses to**
19 **pursue an occupation or profession; and**

20 **“(C) One member who is a person who is working in a field that requires an occupational**
21 **or professional license.**

22 **“(c) The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall**
23 **jointly appoint the chief executive officer of the Oregon State Bar and representatives from**
24 **among the 12 licensing boards, commissions or agencies that receive the largest number of**
25 **applications and grant the largest number of occupational or professional licenses in this**
26 **state.**

27 **“(3) The task force shall:**

28 **“(a) Research and study issues related to occupational and professional licensing in this**
29 **state, with a particular focus on:**

30 **“(A) The extent to which licensing boards, commissions and agencies deny occupational**
31 **and professional licenses or suspend, revoke or refuse to renew previously granted licenses**
32 **on the basis of a previous criminal conviction or juvenile adjudication, along with the number**
33 **of licenses denied, suspended, revoked or denied renewal for that reason in each calendar**
34 **year; and**
