

Requested by SENATE COMMITTEE ON HOUSING AND DEVELOPMENT

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 1537**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “statements” delete the rest of
2 the line and delete line 3 and insert “; and prescribing an effective date.”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 31 and delete pages 2 and 3 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Housing Impact Statements is**
5 **established.**

6 **“(2) The task force consists of 11 members appointed as follows:**

7 **“(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from**
8 **among members of the Senate.**

9 **“(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one**
10 **member from among members of the House of Representatives.**

11 **“(c) The Governor shall appoint the following members:**

12 **“(A) One member who represents homebuilding groups;**

13 **“(B) One member who represents an organization that provides**
14 **counsel services to low-income home buyers;**

15 **“(C) One member who represents environmental groups;**

16 **“(D) One member who represents communities of color;**

17 **“(E) One member who represents local governments;**

18 **“(F) One member who represents home lending;**

19 **“(G) One member who represents the Housing and Community**
20 **Services Department;**

21 **“(H) One member who represents the Oregon Department of Ad-**

1 **ministrative Services; and**

2 **“(I) One member who represents the Department of Land Conser-**
3 **vation and Development.**

4 **“(3) The task force shall conduct a comprehensive review of how**
5 **housing impact statements should be modernized to reflect current**
6 **housing policies and are developed for administrative rules. The task**
7 **force shall consider:**

8 **“(a) Ways to accurately capture the impacts to different types of**
9 **housing in the development of administrative rules.**

10 **“(b) What data would be necessary in the drafting of a housing**
11 **impact statement.**

12 **“(c) How agencies receive information and analyze impacts on**
13 **communities of color, including but not limited to housing costs, dis-**
14 **placement and racial disparities, to ensure impacts are fully consid-**
15 **ered in the drafting of the housing impact statement.**

16 **“(d) How to increase participation in agency rulemaking as it re-**
17 **lates to housing.**

18 **“(e) Ways to ensure that the housing cost impact statement has**
19 **parity with the fiscal impact statement required under ORS 183.335**
20 **(2)(b)(E).**

21 **“(f) Efficient methods to report cumulative data, including the po-**
22 **tential for central repository of housing impact data.**

23 **“(g) Any other considerations necessary to improve the develop-**
24 **ment of housing cost impact statements and notifications to the pub-**
25 **lic.**

26 **“(4) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes**
27 **a quorum for the transaction of business.**

28 **“(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a**
29 **majority of the voting members of the task force.**

30 **“(6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as**

1 **chairperson.**

2 **“(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority**
3 **shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.**

4 **“(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the**
5 **call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the**
6 **task force.**

7 **“(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of**
8 **the task force.**

9 **“(10) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided**
10 **by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to**
11 **a committee or interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related**
12 **to housing no later than September 15, 2023.**

13 **“(11) The Legislative Policy and Research Office shall provide staff**
14 **support to the task force.**

15 **“(12) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task**
16 **force are nonvoting members of the task force and may act in an ad-**
17 **visory capacity only.**

18 **“(13) Members of the task force who are not members of the Leg-**
19 **islative Assembly are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement**
20 **for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.**

21 **“(14) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111,**
22 **are directed to assist the task force in the performance of the duties**
23 **of the task force and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to**
24 **confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the**
25 **task force consider necessary to perform their duties.**

26 **“SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2022 Act is repealed on December 31,**
27 **2023.**

28 **“SECTION 3. This 2022 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the**
29 **date on which the 2022 regular session of the Eighty-first Legislative**
30 **Assembly adjourns sine die.”.**
