**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 1530**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the first semicolon delete the
2 rest of the line and delete line 2 and insert “and declaring an emergency.”.

3 Delete lines 15 through 27 and delete pages 2 through 6 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Health Authority, in collaboration**
5 **with the Department of Consumer and Business Services, shall study**
6 **access to fertility and reproductive endocrinology services by residents**
7 **of this state, including:**

8 **“(a) Availability and utilization of fertility and reproductive**
9 **endocrinology services in the commercial health insurance markets,**
10 **self-insured health plans and the state medical assistance program;**

11 **“(b) Financial and access barriers to obtaining fertility and repro-**
12 **ductive endocrinology services including assisted reproductive tech-**
13 **nology; and**

14 **“(c) Inequities in access to fertility and reproductive endocrinology**
15 **services based on race, ethnicity, gender identity, sexual orientation,**
16 **income, marital status, immigration status and disability.**

17 **“(2) The authority shall provide a preliminary report no later than**
18 **October 31, 2022, and a final report no later than December 1, 2022, to**
19 **the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to health,**
20 **in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, containing the findings of the**
21 **study described in subsection (1) of this section and recommendations**

1 **for:**

2 **“(a) Reducing financial and access barriers to fertility and repro-**
3 **ductive endocrinology services for residents of this state;**

4 **“(b) Strategies to promote equal access to fertility and reproductive**
5 **endocrinology services, including protections against discrimination in**
6 **the provision of fertility and reproductive endocrinology services;**

7 **“(c) A plan to provide equitable access to assisted reproductive**
8 **technology for all residents of this state;**

9 **“(d) The feasibility of obtaining federal financial participation in**
10 **or other federal resources to support the plan described in paragraph**
11 **(c) of this subsection; and**

12 **“(e) Legislative changes necessary to implement the recommen-**
13 **dations under this subsection.**

14 **“SECTION 2. This 2022 Act being necessary for the immediate**
15 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
16 **declared to exist, and this 2022 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**

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
