**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
SENATE BILL 5703**

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after the semicolon insert “amending sections  
2 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 13, 14, 14a, 14c, 17 and 23, chapter 661, Oregon Laws 2021;”.

3 Delete lines 4 through 15 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1.** Section 3, chapter 661, Oregon Laws 2021, is amended to  
5 read:

6 **“Sec. 3.** The following amounts are allocated for the biennium beginning  
7 July 1, 2021, from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund,  
8 to the Oregon Business Development Department, for the following purposes:

10 (1) **Operations**..... \$ 11,300,053

11 (2) Business, innovation

12 [and trade..... \$ 83,591,268]

17 **“SECTION 2.** Section 4, chapter 661, Oregon Laws 2021, is amended to

19 **“Sec. 4.** There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, from  
20 the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Department  
21 of Education, for the State School Fund, the amount of [\$589,526,746]

1 **\$650,508,965.**

2 **“SECTION 3.** Section 5, chapter 661, Oregon Laws 2021, is amended to  
3 read:

4 **“Sec. 5.** There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, from  
5 the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the office of the  
6 Governor, the amount of [~~\$4,552,709~~] **\$4,661,117** for expenses of the Regional  
7 Solutions Program.

8 **“SECTION 4.** Section 6, chapter 661, Oregon Laws 2021, is amended to  
9 read:

10 **“Sec. 6.** (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall es-  
11 tablish a process for allocating available moneys in the Administrative Ser-  
12 vices Economic Development Fund on a quarterly basis to fulfill the biennial  
13 allocations made by sections 1 to 13 [*of this 2021 Act*], **chapter 661, Oregon**  
14 **Laws 2021.** The department shall set the quarterly allocations.

15 **“(2)** If, in any quarter, the moneys transferred from the State Lottery  
16 Fund to the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund are insuf-  
17 ficient to pay for the quarterly allocations made by sections 1 to 13 [*of this*  
18 *2021 Act*], **chapter 661, Oregon Laws 2021**, or any other 2021 Act, prior to  
19 making any other allocations pursuant to sections 1 to 13 [*of this 2021*  
20 *Act*], **chapter 661, Oregon Laws 2021**, the department shall satisfy lottery  
21 bond debt service obligations in the amount of [~~\$278,511,961~~] **\$273,885,133** for  
22 outstanding lottery bonds.

23 **“(3)** After the lottery bond debt service obligations described in subsection  
24 (2) of this section are satisfied, if the remaining moneys transferred from the  
25 State Lottery Fund to the Administrative Services Economic Development  
26 Fund are insufficient to pay for the quarterly allocations made by sections  
27 1 to 13 [*of this 2021 Act*], **chapter 661, Oregon Laws 2021**, the department  
28 shall reduce the quarterly allocations not described in subsection (2) of this  
29 section proportionately in amounts sufficient to accommodate the revenue  
30 shortfall.

1        **SECTION 5.** Section 7, chapter 661, Oregon Laws 2021, is amended to  
2 read:

3        **“Sec. 7.** There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, from  
4 the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon  
5 Department of Administrative Services, the amount of [~~\$278,511,961~~]  
6 **\$273,885,133** for the purpose of paying, when due, the principal, interest and  
7 premium, if any, on outstanding lottery bonds, as described in section 6 [*of*  
8 *this 2021 Act*], **chapter 661, Oregon Laws 2021.**

9        **SECTION 6.** Section 9, chapter 661, Oregon Laws 2021, is amended to  
10 read:

11       **“Sec. 9.** Notwithstanding and in lieu of the requirement in ORS 461.549  
12 (2) for a percentage-based transfer of moneys, for the biennium beginning  
13 July 1, 2021, the amount allocated from the Administrative Services Eco-  
14 nomic Development Fund to the Problem Gambling Treatment Fund is  
15 [~~\$16,514,510~~] **\$16,542,526.**

16       **SECTION 7.** Section 13, chapter 661, Oregon Laws 2021, is amended to  
17 read:

18       **“Sec. 13.** Notwithstanding and in lieu of the allocation described in sec-  
19 tion 44, chapter 355, Oregon Laws 2019, as amended by section 1, chapter 10,  
20 Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, the amount al-  
21 located from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the  
22 Employer Incentive Fund is [~~\$12,665,769~~] **\$15,335,236.**

23       **SECTION 8.** Section 14, chapter 661, Oregon Laws 2021, is amended to  
24 read:

25       **“Sec. 14.** There are allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021,  
26 from the Veterans’ Services Fund, to the Veterans’ Department of Veterans’  
27 Affairs Dedicated Lottery Fund, the following amounts for the following  
28 purposes:

9 amount of [~~\$261,416~~] **\$270,809** for veterans' employment apprenticeship out-  
10 reach and coordination.

11 **“SECTION 10.** Section 14c, chapter 661, Oregon Laws 2021, is amended

13 **“Sec. 14c.** There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021,  
14 from the Veterans' Services Fund, to the Oregon Health Authority, [*the*  
15 *amount of \$2,127,476 for veterans' behavioral health services.*] **the following**  
16 **amounts for the following purposes:**

23 dards and Training, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, from the  
24 Criminal Fine Account, the following amounts for the following purposes:

- 27 **and standards operations..... \$ 44,416,940**
- 28 (2) Public Safety Memorial Fund ..... \$ 279,677

29 **“SECTION 12.** Section 23, chapter 661, Oregon Laws 2021, is amended to  
30 read:

1       **“Sec. 23.** (1) There is allocated to the State School Fund established un-  
2 der ORS 327.008, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, from the Oregon  
3 Marijuana Account, the amount of \$36,000,000.

4       “(2) There is allocated to the Oregon Health Authority, for mental health  
5 treatment or for purposes related to alcohol and drug abuse prevention, early  
6 intervention and treatment services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021,  
7 from the Oregon Marijuana Account, the amount of \$18,000,000.

8       “(3) There is allocated to the Oregon Health Authority, for the health  
9 systems division, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, from the Oregon  
10 Marijuana Account, the amount of \$4,500,000 for purposes related to alcohol  
11 and drug abuse prevention, early intervention and treatment services.

12       “(4) There is allocated to the Oregon Health Authority, for the biennium  
13 beginning July 1, 2021, from the Oregon Marijuana Account, the amount of  
14 [~~\$249,360,000~~] **\$250,527,400**, for deposit into the Drug Treatment and Recovery  
15 Services Fund.

16       “(5) There is allocated to the State Police Account established under ORS  
17 181A.020, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, from the Oregon  
18 Marijuana Account, the amount of \$13,500,000.

19       **“SECTION 13. This 2022 Act being necessary for the immediate**  
20 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**  
21 **declared to exist, and this 2022 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**

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
