We need to incentivize healthy forestry practices and support small forestland owners who want to work their lands in the most sustainable way possible. We need financial incentives to help them protect riparian areas and establish longer harvesting rotations. We know such practices are good for the environment, the climate crisis, AND the quality of timber eventually produced on tracts of land established for timber production- without harmful soil, water, and climate emission consequences. SB 1502 creates an income or corporate excise tax credit for small forestland owners who elect to restrict riparian timber harvest, in lieu of using the harvest option.
