I urge the committee not to increase the taxes on marijuana. Oregon cannabis consumers are very price sensitive. This tax increase of over 300% would drive consumers to the unregulated market. Over the past year, the cannabis market in Oregon has become less stable (once again) with a surplus of supply and sales stagnating. With the existing 17-20% minimum sales tax, our state is already receiving significant funds. Per the public financial reporting statement from the Dept. of Revenue's website, Oregon received \$176,370,910 in 2021 alone. An increase in taxes to the consumer will have a negative impact on sales, the market, and ultimately our communities as a whole. Please do not raise the sales tax maximum.
