My name is Russell Wimmer; I am an actively practicing advanced clinician in Lebanon Oregon, working in both arenas primary care and recovery medicine.

I would like to put my support behind HB 4101 to extend the buffer zone for smoking and vaping and other aerosolized materials from 10 feet to 25 feet.

I believe this does offer significant benefits to the overall public health. I often see children that are exposed to secondhand smoke on a persistent basis, with significantly higher presentations in frequency and severity of asthma and other respiratory disorders because of that exposure.

It has been well-established that firsthand and secondhand smoke both pose significant risks to pulmonary function, with an increased risk of long standing, incurable diseases.
