En el año 2009 emigracion llego a mi apartamento cuando mi nina pequena tenia tan solo tres meses de nacida y tuve que presenciar cuando ICE se llevo a mi esposo, me quedé sola con mi bebe y con la preocupacion de lo que podria pasa con mi esposo. En esa misma noche tuve que ingresar con mi nina de emergencia al hospital, ya que estubo hospitalizada por tres dias.

Ademas de eso tenia que buscar a un abogado para ayudar a mi esposo, y no contabamos con los honorarios. Por este lamentable suceso tuve que ausentarme en mi trabajo por varios dias y por eso mi empleador tomo la decicion de despedirme. Como no contaba con permiso legal para trabajar en este pais, no tuve un apoyo economico por lo que pase en ese momento. Por eso yo ahora quiero pedirles que tomen en cuenta el apoyar la propuesta de Representacion Universal par aque otras personas no pasen lo que a mi me toco vivir.

De esta manera me despido de ustedes deseandoles exitos en sus labores.

Chair Prosanski, Thatcher, and Members of the Senate Judicial Committee.

My name is Juliana. I have lived in Beaverton, Oregon for 12 years. I am a housewife; I have been cleaning houses ever since I had to emigrate to this country. For this reason, I am writing to you to tell you a little about my story of what I have experienced in this country. I got married, I am the mother of five children, four born in Guatemala, and one born in this country.

In the year 2009 immigration came to my apartment when my little girl was only three months old, and she had to witness when ICE took my husband. I was left alone with my baby and concerned about what could happen to my husband. That same night I had to go to the emergency room with my daughter, since she was hospitalized for three days.

On top of that, I had to find a lawyer to help my husband, and we didn't have money to pay for the legal fees. Due to this unfortunate event, I had to be absent from work for several days and that is why my employer made the decision to fire me. As I did not have legal permission to work in this country, I did not have financial support for what I went through at that time. That is why I now want to ask you to consider supporting the proposal for Universal Representation so that other people do not go through what I had to go through.

In this way I say goodbye to you, wishing you success in your work.
