RE: HB 4080: Predator Damage Control District funding

Chair Marsh and members of the House Committee On Environment and Natural Resources:

The Coos-Curry County Farm Bureau supports HB 4080, repealing the sunset on the 2015 HB 3188 legislation dealing with Predator Damage Control Districts and reinstating the Predator Damage Control Districts that were in existence on January 1, 2022. The formation of Districts created an important avenue for the voluntary assessment. The District dollars go directly to the County to help with funding the County Program. Many of our members are part of the Coos County Predator Damage Control District. Livestock producers each year loose valuable livestock to predation as well as the timber industry in our area loses millions of board feet of timber due to bear damage. This important tool allows producers to stay in business and assist the County with funding the program which has been in existence for close to half a century. It does not stop predation but manages the numbers of those who actually kill livestock, damage trees and other infrastructure as well as provides for public safety.
