Thank you for the opportunity to communicate with you why I am firmly opposed to this bill and ask you to vote NO and set it aside as unworthy and detrimental to Oregon citizens.

- Using the last four digits of peoples' Social Security number puts their identification at risk. The Secretary of State's office, among other state offices, have been hacked previously. No upgrades or additional security measures have been taken, so this discussion is inappropriate and foolhardy.
- If the computers maintaining this data have already been breached by hackers, an image of a person's signature will be easily available to be used for criminal purposes, endangering the financial and economic well-being of our voters.
- Many states do not allow ballot harvesting, since it opens up the possibility of fraud. To allow third party organizations to electronically submit registration cards on behalf of others exposes all this information – social security information and signatures ready to be used in any way they wish – to people unknown by individual voters. In addition to ballot harvesting you are allowing personal and private information of our voters to be harvested. This is unconscionable.

If this bill is passed it clearly shows your disregard for both our citizens and the integrity of our elections.
