OREGON GOVERNMENT ETHICS COMMISSION

Statement of Economic Interest²

Required.

Composition³

The commission has nine members, eight of whom must be from among persons recommended by legislative leadership: two recommendations each by Democratic and Republican party leadership in each chamber of the Legislative Assembly. No more than three members may be members of the same political party.⁴

- House Democrat recommendations: MCAULEY (D), PAYNE (D)
- House Republican recommendations: BURKE (L), MASON (R)
- Senate Democrat recommendations: HOLLISTER (D), NEWELL (N/A)
- Senate Republican recommendations: LINDSAY (R); THOMPSON (R)
- A ninth appointee: FISKUM (N/A).

A person who holds any public office for which a statement of economic interest is required, except as a member of the commission, may not be appointed. Members serve four-year terms and may not serve more than two full terms and may serve out an unexpired term. The commission elects its chair and vice chair. A quorum consists of five members, but a final decision may not be made without an affirmative vote of a majority of the members appointed to the commission.

Duties⁵

The commission administers and enforces state government ethics laws, lobby regulation laws, and the executive session provisions of Oregon's public meetings laws. The commission must:

- administer statement of economic interest requirements for specified public officials, candidates, and participating political subdivisions;
- develop a filing, coding, and cross-indexing system;
- receive and review conflict of interest records submitted by a public body;
- receive and review rules or policies adopted by a state agency or statewide public association that interpret provisions of ethics laws;
- administer legal expense trust fund requirements for public officials;
- estimate operating expenses for each biennium and assess specified public bodies an appropriate portion of those expenses;
- receive, review, investigate, and report findings on filed ethics complaints;
- accept and file any information voluntarily supplied that exceeds the requirements of ethics laws;
- prepare and publish reports;
- make statements and information filed with the commission available for public inspection and copying during regular office hours;
- not later than February 1 of each odd-numbered year, report to the Legislative Assembly on any recommended changes to the statutes administered by the commission;
- adopt rules necessary to carry out statutory duties;
- administer an electronic filing system for filing required statements;
- make statements filed with the commission, advisory opinions issued by the commission or the executive director of the commission, findings of a violation of Oregon government ethics laws, and lobbyist registration statements searchable via the internet;
- appoint an executive director to serve at the pleasure of the commission;

- prepare, publish, and distribute a manual on government ethics that explains the requirements of Oregon government ethics laws and the commission's interpretation of those requirements;
- prepare and present a program of continuing education for public officials;
- annually report to the Legislative Equity Officer on training attended by registered lobbyists; and
- administer lobbyist registration requirements.

The commission may:6

- retain or appoint qualified legal counsel when the Attorney General concurrently represents more than one public official or agency in any matter before the commission and certain criteria are met;
- issue and publish written advisory opinions on the application of ethics laws to any proposed transaction or action or any actual or hypothetical circumstance; and
- impose civil penalties and issue written letters of reprimand, explanation, or education for specified violations.
