Composition³

The board consists of nine members who are U.S. citizens and Oregon residents, representing geographic, ethnic, gender, racial, and economic diversities, to the extent possible, with demonstrated leadership in their professional and civic lives, and collectively offering experience in consumer advocacy, management of a company that offers health insurance, public health, finance, organized labor, health care, and small business operation (ARANA, **GERMANN**, **HEMMINGS**, **ISAACSON**, JOHNSON, KRAMER, MORAN, SAMPSON, SANTA).⁴

Appointees serve four-year terms; at least one must have an active Oregon license to provide health care; no more than four may be employed or derive household income from health care during board tenure or during the 12-month period prior to appointment; or who receive health care benefits from a publicly funded state health benefit plan.

The Governor designates the chair and vice-chair; a majority constitutes a quorum; and the board must meet at least once a month and at least once every two years in each congressional district.

Duties⁵

The board oversees and makes policy for the Oregon Health Authority (OHA). The board must:

- develop a program to provide health insurance premium assistance to all lowand moderate-income residents;
- publish anonymized, aggregate data collected by OHA;
- establish evidence-based clinical standards and practice guidelines for providers;
- approve and monitor community-centered health initiatives that are consistent with public health goals, strategies, programs, and performance standards, and report to the Legislative Assembly;
- establish cost-containment mechanisms to reduce health care costs;
- ensure that the health care workforce is sufficient in numbers and training to meet demand created by the expansion in health coverage, health care system transformations, an increasingly diverse population, and an aging workforce;
- work with Oregon's congressional delegation;
- establish a health benefit package as the baseline for plans offered through the health insurance exchange;
- investigate and report annually to the Legislative Assembly;
- meet cost-containment goals;
- oversee the expenditure of moneys from the Health Care Workforce Strategic Fund;
- work with the Public Health Benefit Purchasers Committee, administrators of the medical assistance program (Medicaid), and the Department of Corrections to identify uniform contracting standards for health benefit plans;
- appoint membership to and work with the Health Information Technology Oversight Council; and

• establish and work with specified committees.

The board may:

- subject to the approval of the Governor, organize and reorganize OHA as the board considers necessary to properly conduct its work; and
- submit directly to the Legislative Counsel, no later than October 1 of each evennumbered year, legislative measure requests necessary for statutory authorization to carry out its duties or to implement recommendations.
