# **PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION**

The Governor has appointed the following individual to the Public Utility Commission subject to Senate confirmation.<sup>1</sup> This is a full time, paid position.

#### Statement of Economic Interest<sup>2</sup>

## **Statutory Requirements**<sup>3</sup>

The commission consists of three members, no more than two of whom may be of the same political party (DECKER (D), PERKINS (N/A), **TAWNEY (D)**).

Commissioners serve four-year terms and hold office until a successor has been appointed. The Governor may remove a commissioner for any cause after an opportunity for a hearing. Each commissioner must take an oath to support the United States Constitution and the Oregon Constitution. The Governor designates the chair. A majority constitutes a quorum.

No commissioner may:

- hold any other office of profit;
- hold any office or position under any political committee or party;
- hold any pecuniary interest in any business entity conducting operations that would be subject to the commission's regulatory jurisdiction; or

• hold any pecuniary interest in, have any contract of employment with, or have any substantial voluntary transactions with any business or activity subject to the commission's regulatory jurisdiction.

#### **Duties**<sup>4</sup>

The commission regulates rates of investor-owned electric, natural gas, and telephone utilities, and of select water companies. It also enforces electric and natural gas safety standards and handles utility-related dispute resolutions.

The commission must:

- dismiss any commission employee who fails to file pecuniary interest statements or fails to divest interests when ordered by the commission;
- represent public or telecommunications utility customers in controversies respecting rates, valuations, and service;
- make use of the jurisdiction and powers of the office to protect customers from unjust and unreasonable exactions and practices;
- establish fair and reasonable rates while balancing the interests of the utility investor and the consumer;
- keep office at the capital;
- inquire into violation of the laws and report all violations to the Attorney General;
- keep a record of all moneys deposited in the Public Utility Commission Account;
- establish, assess, and collect annual fees to be paid by regulated utilities; and
- receive, initiate, investigate, and adjudicate complaints.
