Public Hearing and Work Session

HB 3368

Directs Water Resources Department to produce state of water resources report and basin water assessments.

Please note: HB 3207 is scheduled solely for the purpose of hearing testimony from people who previously signed up to testify at the meeting on March 30, 2023.

HB 3207

Amends reporting requirements for real estate transaction sampling of domestic wells to require labs conducting tests to submit results to Department of Environmental Quality.

HB 3124

Requires Water Resources Department to study drought.

HB 3362

Allows city or county to validate unit of land that had been approved for creation or recognition that was later revoked after sale to innocent purchaser.

HB 2192

Aligns criteria for alteration, restoration or replacement of a dwellings on lands zoned for forest use consistent with criteria applicable to dwellings on lands zoned for farm use.

Please note: HB 3021 is scheduled solely for the purpose of hearing testimony from people who previously signed up to testify at the meeting on March 30, 2023.

HB 3021

Establishes that perfected and developed water right is not subject to forfeiture if owner of water right ceased to use all or part of water appropriated for period of five successive years because owner engaged in water conservation practices or distribution of water that owner received from water district was less than certificated maximum for period of at least five successive years.

HB 3052

Requires Department of State Lands to study natural resources in Oregon.

HB 3343

Requires Water Resources Department to study sustainable management of ground water.

HB 3365

Authorizes certain Deschutes Basin irrigation districts to temporarily allow change of place of use of water, or change in point of diversion, within Deschutes Basin irrigation districts.

HB 2631 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Provides that compensation for loss or injury to livestock or working dogs under wolf depredation compensation and financial assistance grant program must be based on multiplier of not more than seven times fair market value of livestock or working dogs and recommendation of county advisory committee.

HB 2633

Allows person who submits application for compensation under wolf depredation compensation and financial assistance grant program to amend application.

HB 3086

Clarifies process of Senate confirmation of members of State Fish and Wildlife Commission.

HB 3179

Requires State Department of Energy to study permitting requirements for renewable energy facilities and to develop recommendations to improve permitting process.

HB 3181

Directs State Department of Energy and Department of Land Conservation and Development to convene work group to examine barriers, opportunities and other issues related to renewable energy and transmission project siting in Oregon.

HB 3163

Establishes Place-Based Water Planning Fund.

HB 2238

Authorizes Director of Department of State Lands to adopt rules establishing fees related to removal or fill permit applications, wetland delineation reports and general authorizations.

HB 2765

Grants to South Suburban Sanitary District exclusive right to use and sell treated wastewater discharged by district into Klamath River or tributaries.

HB 2929

Authorizes Water Resources Department to seek injunctive relief if person has engaged, or is about to engage, in activity that is or will be violation of certain water laws.

Note change: HB 2192, HB 2631, HB 2633, HB 2765, HB 2929 HB 3021 and HB 3362 have been added. HB 3052, HB 3207, HB 3343, HB 3365, and HB 3368 have been updated. HB 3180 has been removed.
