HB 2235

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/27/2023 MEETING: Requires Oregon Health Authority to study access to behavioral health treatment in rural and medically underserved areas of this state.

HB 2817

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/27/2023 MEETING: Clarifies area of leg to which definition of "podiatry" applies.

HB 2977 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission, in collaboration with Oregon Health Authority, to establish grant program for purpose of distributing moneys to institutions of higher education to develop programs that prepare students to enter into behavioral health workforce.

- HB 2651 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Health Authority to be used for specified purposes related to expanding behavioral health provider workforce.
- HB 2485 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Requires Portland State University, subject to sufficient moneys being appropriated, to enhance state's capacity to educate public mental health and addiction treatment providers by July 1, 2028, by materially increasing number of graduates from relevant degree programs.
- HB 3274 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Requires Southern Oregon University, subject to appropriation of sufficient moneys, to address state's behavioral and mental health needs by materially increasing number of mental health practitioners who graduate in southern Oregon and teaching behavioral and mental health competencies through alternative academic pathways.
- HB 3090  
Prohibits distributing, selling, attempting to sell or allowing to be sold flavored inhalant delivery system product or flavored tobacco product in this state.
- HB 3320  
Imposes new requirements on hospitals with respect to financial assistance policies and processes.
- HB 2878 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Establishes Aligning for Health Pilot Program, administered by Oregon Health Authority, to test alternative methods for payment for health care.
- HB 2397  
Requires Oregon Health Authority to study opioid overdose prevention.
- HB 3300  
Authorizes Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists to issue limited permit to qualified applicant.
