Work Session

HB 2057

Makes contractor liable for unpaid wages, including other benefit payment or contributions of employee of subcontractor at any tier.

HB 2649

Provides that qualifying agency must require as material provision of public improvement contract that contractor establish and implement plan for outreach to and recruitment and retention of women, minority individuals and veterans to perform work under public improvement contract, with aspirational target of having individuals in one or more of these groups perform at least 15 percent of total work hours that workers perform under public improvement contract.

HB 2982

Requires insurer to offer 70 percent of coverage insured previously purchased for contents of residence to insured without requiring inventory of loss if total loss of contents occurs as result of major disaster.

HB 3049

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-20-2023 MEETING: Directs Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission to establish annual registration program and labeling requirements for industrial hemp commodity or product that contains cannabinoids and is intended for human or animal consumption.

HB 3242

Provides insured with cause of action for insurer's unfair claim settlement practices.

HB 3243

Includes insurance in definition of real estate, goods and services that are subject to penalties for unlawful trade practices.

HB 3332

Requires state contracting agency that procures public improvement contract or contract for public works to include in solicitation documents conspicuous notice that resulting public improvement contract or contract for public works will require contractors to use iron, steel, coatings for iron and steel and manufactured products that are made in United States.

HB 3412

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-20-2023 MEETING: Authorizes physician assistants to provide compensable medical services and authorize payment of temporary disability benefits under same rules as nurse practitioners for workers' compensation claims.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 2515

Allows marijuana producer, marijuana wholesaler, marijuana processor or marijuana retailer to use motion detection camera system at licensed premises.

HB 2517

Exempts cannabis businesses from first-source hiring agreement requirements in enterprise zones.

HB 3541

Extends exemption of insured employer from liability outside workers' compensation law to employer's parent company and related entities of employer under same parent company.
