Work Session

HB 2008

Specifies property and funds of judgment debtor that are exempt from execution or garnishment.

HB 2053

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-20-2023 MEETING: Provides that person that carries on, conducts or transacts business in county of this state under assumed business name that person has not registered or for which person does not maintain registration lacks standing in courts of this state to maintain action on behalf of business.

HB 2277

Removes exemption from regulation by Department of Consumer and Business Services for self-insured plans of insurance operating solely in this state.

HB 2517

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2023 MEETING: Exempts cannabis businesses from first-source hiring agreement requirements in enterprise zones.

HB 2556

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2023 MEETING: Requires that itemized statements provided to employees explain, in plain language, amount and purpose of each deduction.

HB 2649

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2023 MEETING: Provides that qualifying agency must require as material provision of public improvement contract that contractor establish and implement plan for outreach to and recruitment and retention of women, minority individuals and veterans to perform work under public improvement contract, with aspirational target of having individuals in one or more of these groups perform at least 15 percent of total work hours that workers perform under public improvement contract.

HB 2800

Clarifies meaning of "because of age" in employment discrimination law.

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HB 2920

Directs insurer to consider only specified information in determining rates for motor vehicle liability insurance policy.

HB 2921

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2023 MEETING: Requires hospitals to file certain reports showing demographics of hospitals' workforces with Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries for posting to Bureau of Labor and Industries' website.

HB 3028

Prohibits employer from requiring employee to use vacation, sick or annual leave for time spent by employee as appointed member of board, commission, council or committee created by statute.

HB 3183

Requires Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission to require applicant for cannabis-related license or license renewal to submit signed attestation that applicant will refrain from interfering with labor organizing efforts or submit attestation that applicant and labor organization that is certified to represent employees of applicant have entered into and will abide by terms of labor peace agreement.

HB 3205

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2023 MEETING: Modifies definition of "compensation," for purposes of pay equity requirements, to exclude hiring bonuses and retention bonuses.

HB 3227

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2023 MEETING: Makes changes to Custodians' Civil Service Law to remove barriers to filling employment vacancies and remove certain qualifications for members of civil service board.

HB 3306

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2023 MEETING: Requires entity that receives funds for certain workforce program initiatives to establish wage standards for individuals who participate in program administered by entity if, under program, entity provides individuals with paid work experience.

HB 3471

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-27-2023 MEETING: Prohibits employer from entering into settlement or agreement disposing of workers' compensation claim that bars worker from seeking further employment with employer unless such provision is first requested by worker.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 3233

Provides that, for purpose of specifying prevailing rate of wage for electrical workers, locality is geographical area within which each local union is exclusive representative for local union's membership, and collective bargaining agreement is collective bargaining agreement to which local union is party.

HB 3568

Requires Bureau of Labor and Industries to study issues related to working conditions of warehouse workers.
