- HB 3005 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Housing and Community Services Department to provide financial assistance to eligible applicants to pay for allowable costs related to early child care infrastructure activities.
- HB 2623 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Tax Expenditures
Creates income tax credit for child care workers employed in rural areas.
- HB 2957 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Department of Human Services to establish program to distribute funds to community-based organizations to provide financial assistance to Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals status recipients for specified purposes.
- HB 2991 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Department of Early Learning and Care to commission independent study regarding barriers to attaining high quality early childhood workforce.
- HB 2504
Directs Early Learning Council, in consultation with Office of Child Care and Oregon Center for Career Development in Childhood Care and Education, to adopt rules to address barriers impeding entry into early childhood workforce by international early childhood professionals.
- HB 3009 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Department of Human Services to establish and administer program to provide services to youth with acute needs and families of such youth.
- HB 2589 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires Department of Human Services to determine staffing levels needed to complete assessments within 20 days for individuals seeking enrollment in programs for all-inclusive care for elderly, and to submit agency request budget each biennium that reflects resources needed to meet determined staffing levels.
