#### Work Session

SB 491

Requires health insurance coverage of specified fertility services and treatments with exemption for certain insurers.

SB 450

Exempts from labeling requirements drug intended to reverse opioid overdose when drug is dispensed by physician or physician assistant.

SB 564 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Appropriates moneys to be used for regional health equity coalitions.

SB 558

Exempts from regulation by Advisory Council on Hearing Aids and Health Licensing Office over-the-counter hearing aid.

SB 818

Directs Oregon Health Authority to develop list of suicide risk assessment and treatment continuing education opportunities for specified physical health care providers.

SB 411

Adds certain hospital, medical and infectious waste incinerators to facilities at which covered drugs under drug takeback program may be disposed of.

SB 969

Removes requirement that Oregon State Board of Nursing certify as nursing assistant any qualified applicant.

SB 703

Requires passage of specified examination for certification as nursing assistant.

SB 469 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes Indian Health Scholarship Program to provide free tuition and fees for qualifying Indian health profession students in exchange for student commitment to work at tribal service site after graduation.

SB 916

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study public health.

### Public Hearing

SB 1043 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires providers of substance use treatment or detoxification services, hospitals, long term care facilities, residential care facilities and providers of outpatient physical or behavioral health services, upon release, discharge or transfer of patient or resident or at conclusion of patient visit, to provide two doses of overdose reversal medication and medical supplies necessary to administer medication if patient or resident has prescription for opioid medication or has history of opioid use.

SB 1044

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study access to behavioral health treatment.

SB 1046

Expands network adequacy requirements to health benefit plans offered to large employers and modifies requirements.

SB 1076

Requires licensed hospitals to include in hospital's discharge policy specified procedures for discharge of homeless patients.
