- SB 704 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Establishes Universal Health Plan Governance Board and directs board to create comprehensive plan for implementing Universal Health Plan beginning in 2027.
- SB 404  
Requires State Board of Pharmacy to study prescription drugs.
- SB 965  
Allows Oregon Health Authority to conduct off-site investigation after receiving certain complaints against hospitals.
- SB 966  
Requires Oregon Health Authority to adopt standards for types of data collected for all payer, all claims database that are consistent with standards adopted for collection of data on race, ethnicity, language, disability status, sexual orientation and gender identity.
- SB 968  
Requires Oregon Health Authority, in consultation with System of Care Advisory Council, to study Oregon's systems of care.
- SB 432 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Requires Oregon Health Authority to develop, implement and administer program to support consumer engagement efforts aimed at increasing and optimizing consumer involvement in planning and decision-making surrounding the access to, and the delivery of, behavioral health services in this state.
- SB 191  
Requires Oregon Health Authority to study fee-for-service medical assistance recipients' access to health care providers in rural areas of this state.
- SB 303  
Directs Oregon Health Authority to require psilocybin service centers and psilocybin service facilitators licensed by authority to collect and report specified data.

SB 1041

Prohibits cost-sharing on certain health insurance coverage of supplemental and diagnostic breast examinations.

SB 1074 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Oregon Health Authority to administer two-year demonstration project in two counties to test whether expanding scope of compensable services provided by community health workers can improve outcomes for low-income families and children at risk of entering foster care system.

SB 60

Prohibits Oregon Health Authority from requiring associate degree or higher for eligibility for licensure as emergency medical services provider.

SB 492

Imposes new requirements on the determination of health services to be provided in state medical assistance program.
