SB 966

Requires Oregon Health Authority to adopt standards for types of data collected for all payer, all claims database that are consistent with standards adopted for collection of data on race, ethnicity, language, disability status, sexual orientation and gender identity.

SB 190

Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to study factors contributing to cost of health insurance premiums.

SB 922

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study screening for diseases.

SB 1079

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study hospital licensing requirements.

SB 584 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Oregon Health Authority to implement website with functionality to provide online scheduling portal for health care providers that participate in medical assistance to use to contact health care interpreters directly and to process billing.

SB 1085

Allows pharmacist to test and provide treatment for certain health conditions.

SB 1043 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires providers of substance use treatment or detoxification services, hospitals, long term care facilities, residential care facilities and providers of outpatient physical or behavioral health services, upon release, discharge or transfer of patient or resident or at conclusion of patient visit, to provide two doses of overdose reversal medication and medical supplies necessary to administer medication if patient or resident has prescription for opioid medication or has history of opioid use.

SB 1076

Requires licensed hospitals to include in hospital's discharge policy specified procedures for discharge of homeless patients.

SB 192

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study ways to lower cost of prescription drugs.

SB 1074 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Oregon Health Authority to administer two-year demonstration project in two counties to test whether expanding scope of compensable services provided by community health workers can improve outcomes for low-income families and children at risk of entering foster care system.

SB 624 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes certified community behavioral health clinic program in Oregon Health Authority.

SB 492

Imposes new requirements on the determination of health services to be provided in state medical assistance program.
