Public Hearing

- SB 610 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Food for All Oregonians Program within Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program to provide nutrition assistance to residents of this state who would qualify for federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program but for immigration status.
- SB 856
Establishes COFA Food Assistance Program to provide nutrition assistance to COFA citizens who would qualify for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits but for their immigration status and who have incomes at or below federal poverty guidelines.
- SB 609
Directs Department of Human Services to consider hours worked as graduate assistant as hours worked in employment for purpose of meeting work requirements in Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.

Work Session

- SB 573
Directs Center for Health Statistics to enter name of parent on original record of live birth when paternity or parentage has been determined under certain circumstances.
- SB 794
Exempts certain providers of adoption placement services from specified reporting requirements.
- SB 901
Confers authority to Director of Human Services to issue investigative subpoenas for production of specified records in child abuse investigations.
- SB 208
Grants juvenile court continuing wardship jurisdiction upon establishment of permanent guardianship, regardless of whether original bases for wardship jurisdiction continue to exist.
- SB 231 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Department of Human Services to establish and maintain centralized child abuse reporting system.
