Work Session

SB 548

Directs Department of Human Services to maintain inventory of luggage carriers for use when transporting personal effects of foster children.

SB 569 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires closed-captioned television receivers in public areas within places of public accommodation to display closed captioning unless exception applies.

SB 574 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Prohibits use of public funds for out-of-state residential placement of students.

SB 573

Directs Center for Health Statistics to enter name of parent on original record of live birth when paternity or parentage has been determined under certain circumstances.

Public Hearing

SB 210

Requires Department of Human Services to study exceptions to mandatory abuse reporting requirements of department employees who provide assistance to domestic violence victims.

SB 995 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Department of Education to approve training program in restraint and seclusion of student only if program is one of nationally recognized programs that has been designated by Department of Human Services as satisfying department's certification requirements for use of restraint and seclusion.

SB 1024

Modifies provisions regarding retention of records of incidents involving the use of restraints or seclusion of children in care and students in public education programs.

SB 769

Directs Department of Human Services to use information acquired during abuse investigations arising from actions of child in care to make certain assessments regarding placement.

SB 1028

Modifies definition of "abuse" for purposes of child abuse to include verbal abuse.
