SB 93

Requires Department of Human Services to study department's processes for delivering services to aging adults.

SB 94

Requires Department of Human Services to study demographics of children in Oregon.

SB 759

Requires Department of Human Services to ensure that adults receiving developmental disability services receive supports necessary to live in homes they own or rent and with support of roommates that they choose.

SB 106

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/22/2023 MEETING: Requires Department of Human Services to study disposition rates of child abuse investigations.

SB 98

SB 91 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Department of Human Services to request from Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services approval of waiver to obtain federal financial participation in costs of program to pay parents of minor children with disabilities to provide attendant care services to children. 570

SB 5'

Requires Department of Human Services to contract with up to two agencies providing agency with choice services.

SB 609

Directs Department of Human Services to consider hours worked as graduate assistant as hours worked in employment for purpose of meeting work requirements in Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.

SB 610 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes Food for All Oregonians Program within Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program to provide nutrition assistance to residents of this state who would qualify for federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program but for immigration status.

SB 790

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/22/2023 MEETING: Modifies definition of "abuse" for purposes of child abuse to include violations of existing laws prohibiting infliction of corporal punishment on students and use of restraint and seclusion on students.

SB 792

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/22/2023 MEETING: Requires Department of Human Services to report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health, no later than September 15, 2024, on implementation of agency with choice.

SB 769

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/22/2023 MEETING: Directs Department of Human Services to use information acquired during abuse investigations arising from actions of child in care to make certain assessments regarding placement.

SB 995 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/22/2023 MEETING: Requires Department of Education to approve training program in restraint and seclusion of student only if program is one of nationally recognized programs that has been designated by Department of Human Services as satisfying department's certification requirements for use of restraint and seclusion.

SB 820

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/22/2023 MEETING: Requires Oregon Health Authority to provide community-based services and supports to individuals with complex mental or behavioral health needs who are under 21 years of age.

Possible Work Session

SB 99

Requires Department of Human Services to study department's processes for delivering services to aging adults.

SB 209

Requires Department of Human Services to study options for protecting from disclosure in certain proceedings information regarding sexual orientation, gender identity and gender expression of children in department's custody.

SB 241

Requires state agency or local government, before providing assistance or benefits to residents of this state who do not have regular access to, or face barriers in attaining, shelter or housing, employment, health care, child care, food, clothing or other basic necessities to fully inform resident of assistance or benefits available from funded federal programs and require resident to apply for or enroll in federal program of assistance or benefits.

SB 865

Directs Department of Human Services to begin search for relative placement resources immediately upon child or ward entering substitute care.
