SB 353

Requires Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission to study cannabis.

SB 528 **

Modifies provisions relating to protective proceedings.

For the purpose of consideration of the amendment only.

SB 915

Creates Deadly Force Prosecutions Unit within Criminal Justice Division of Department of Justice.

SB 256

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-28-2023 MEETING: Prohibits person from knowingly or intentionally manufacturing, importing, distributing, offering for sale, selling or leasing or otherwise transferring, or installing or reinstalling counterfeit automobile supplemental restraint system component, nonfunctional airbag or object that does not comply with federal standard for make, model and year of motor vehicle.

SB 344

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study use of technology to improve accuracy when measuring recidivism rates of persons convicted of felonies, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.

SB 376

Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to study insurance.

SB 619 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-28-2023 MEETING: Permits consumers to obtain from a controller that processes consumer personal data confirmation as to whether controller is processing consumer's personal data and categories of personal data controller is processing, list of specific third parties to which controller has disclosed consumer's personal data and copy of all of consumer's personal data that controller has processed or is processing.

SB 697

Modifies process for setting aside convictions and guilty except for insanity judgments.

SB 698 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Judicial Department to develop and implement automated system that identifies convictions, arrests, citations, charges and judgments of guilty except for insanity that are eligible to be automatically sealed.

SB 780

Creates offense of unlawful fender height modifications.

SB 808

Modifies membership and other provisions relating to the Commission on Statewide Law Enforcement Standards of Conduct and Discipline.

SB 848

Extends provision relating to indemnification provisions in construction agreements to all types of damages.

SB 891

Modifies provisions relating to Oregon Death with Dignity Act.

SB 951

Provides that certified parole and probation officer employed by State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision qualifies as police officer under Public Employees Retirement System.

SB 1061

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-28-2023 MEETING: Directs Oregon Cannabis Commission, Oregon Health Authority, Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission and Department of Revenue to work collaboratively to ensure access to cannabis for Oregonians.
