##### Placeholder Bills

SB 330

Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to study Indian tribes.

SB 332

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study access to behavioral health treatment in rural and medically underserved areas of this state.

SB 341

Requires State Court Administrator to study courts.

SB 347

Requires Oregon Youth Authority to study issues related to youth.

SB 349

Directs Department of Justice to study ways to improve provision of crime victim services, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.

SB 356

Requires Oregon State Bar to study attorneys.

SB 358

Requires Oregon State Bar to study rules of evidence.

SB 359

Requires Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study issues relating to law enforcement officers.

SB 366

Directs Department of Justice to study possible modifications to post-conviction relief proceeding procedures to increase efficiency, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.

Directs Department of Corrections to study issues relating to prison evacuations due to wildfire, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.
- SB 368  
Directs Department of Corrections to study availability of adult education programming within department institutions, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.
- SB 369  
Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study ways to improve efficiency of procedures for setting aside convictions, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.
- SB 371  
Requires State Court Administrator to study court lawsuits.
- SB 375  
Requires State Court Administrator to study court civil proceedings.
- SB 381  
Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study effect of payment of fines on recidivism rates, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.
- SB 382  
Directs Judicial Department to study establishment of Central Violations Bureau, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.
- SB 385  
Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study effect of different types of sentences on recidivism rates, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.
- SB 387  
Directs Department of Corrections to study programs available to adults in custody, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.
- SB 388  
Deletes obsolete reference to definition of "alternative fuel vehicle." Defines "alternative fuel vehicle."
- SB 389  
Directs Department of Justice to study ways to address domestic violence, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.
- SB 390  
Requires Oregon Health Authority to study availability of mental health treatment in rural areas of Oregon.
- SB 393  
Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study effect of sentencing types on recidivism rates, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2024.
