Work Session

HB 2270

Modernizes certain provisions of Oregon Port Revolving Fund program.

HB 2296 A

Extends sunset from 2024 to 2034 on provisions allowing retired member of Public Employees Retirement System to be reemployed by participating public employer for unlimited number of hours without reduction in pension benefits.

HB 2573 A

Requires Employment Relations Board to develop guidelines and procedures for authorizations designating bargaining representatives of bargaining unit to be prepared and signed electronically.

HB 2922

Increases bond amounts that persons licensed by Construction Contractors Board must maintain.

HB 3140

Removes requirement that Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board solicit new bids for actuarial or technical support every three years.

HB 3200 A

Repeals provision specifying fiscal year end date for credit unions.

HB 3331

Amends eligibility requirements for employee to receive benefits under shared work plan.

Public Hearing

HB 2759 A

Provides that person that knows or consciously avoids knowing that another person is engaging in act or practice that violates laws that regulate telephone solicitations or use of automatic dialing and announcing devices and nonetheless provides substantial assistance or support for violation is liable for loss and subject to penalty to same extent as person that engaged in violation.

HB 2982 A

Requires insurer to offer 70 percent of coverage insured previously purchased for contents of residence to insured without requiring inventory of loss if total loss of contents occurs as result of major disaster.
