Re: Committee drafts for introduction on January 18, 2023

- 1. **LC 1010 (dated 12/1/2023)** expands the definition of "abuse" for the purposes of child abuse to include restraint or seclusion and the infliction of corporal punishment. Declares emergency, effective on passage.
- 2. LC 1032 (dated 12/6/2023) is a placeholder relating to applied behavior analysis.
- 3. **LC 3651** (dated 1/9/2023) exempts programs that provide adoption placement services but do not provide care or services to children from the quarterly reporting requirements detailing the program's use of restraint and involuntary seclusion. Declares emergency, effective on passage.
- 4. LC 1183 (dated 10/4/22) is a placeholder relating to providers of developmental disability services.
- 5. LC 1203 (11/16/22) allows guardian to make medical decisions on behalf of a protected person. Creates presumption that protected persons consent to ordinary, necessary, and preventive health care, except when clear and convincing evidence is present that the protected person would withhold consent to a specific treatment, if able. Instructs guardians to petition the court if the guardian reasonably believes that consenting to or withholding consent to a specific treatment would unreasonably harm or endanger the health or welfare of the protected person.
