Measure Description:

Provides that "attempted transfer," for purposes of Uniform Controlled Substances Act, includes possession of controlled substance with intent to transfer to another person.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Oregon Youth Authority, District Attorneys, Judicial Department, Public Defense Services Commission, Department of Justice, Department of Corrections, Counties, Cities, Criminal Justice Commission

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transferring the measure from the House Committee on Education to the House Committee on Judiciary.

The measure states that "attempted transfer" includes possession of a controlled substance with the intent to transfer to another person and states that an unlawful possession of a controlled substance in Schedule II is a Class A misdemeanor if possession is one gram or more or five or more user units of fentanyl. The measure also provides that unlawful manufacture or delivery of a controlled substance that results in the death of another person is a Class A felony.

A more complete fiscal analysis on the measure will be prepared as the measure is considered in the House Committee on Judiciary.
