

HB 2864 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Adds employees of Department of Corrections and of Oregon Corrections Enterprises, and parole and probation officers who supervise adult offenders to list of employees that may be charged certain representation fees.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

ORS 243.672(5) permits exclusive representative of a bargaining unit to charge employees who are not members of the labor organization reasonable fees and costs for representation unrelated to the negotiation of a collective bargaining agreement. Currently, the statute applies to public safety organizations that represent municipal police officers, sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, and police officers commissioned by a university.

House Bill 2864 adds Oregon Department of Corrections and of Oregon Corrections Enterprises, and parole and probation officers who supervise adult offenders to the list of classes who can be charged fees for representation unrelated to the negotiation of a collective bargaining agreement.
