

HB 2651 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Appropriates \$81 million from the General Fund to Oregon Health Authority for specified purposes related to expanding behavioral health workforce. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2023.

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued.

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

In 2021, the Oregon Legislature invested \$1.35 billion in the state's behavioral health system to improve the state's behavioral health crisis system, support the implementation of Measure 110 (2020), increase access to residential treatment, and support behavioral health workforce recruitment and retention. That same year, the Legislative Assembly passed House Bill 2949, directing the Oregon Health Authority to provide incentives to increase the recruitment and retention of culturally responsive behavioral health workforce. In 2022, House Bill 4071 updated the description of individuals eligible for these incentives.

House Bill 2651 would appropriate \$81 million to the Oregon Health Authority for specified purposes related to expanding the state's behavioral health workforce.
