MAJOR BUDGETARY ISSUES UNIQUE TO THE OREGON RACING COMMISSION

- Fewer Race Days
- Revenue Reduction from Loss of Historic Racing
- > Loss of ADW revenue due to legislative changes
- Reduction in Thoroughbred breeding due to concerns about long-term health of the industry has resulted in smaller field sizes
- Lack of on-site Off-Track Betting (OTB) at the commercial track



Reduce expenses by moving to 100% remote office space



Reduction in related services such as: office networking and other various services



Reduction in Research analyst position



New database will create automations that will save in staffing costs



Reduction in overtime based on reworking staffing assignments
