Program information

- ORS 181A.870 grants the Board on Public Safety Standards and Training, in collaboration with the Private Security and Investigator Policy Committee
- Fee based program
- Approximately 20,000 private security providers licensed or certified in Oregon/1,500 private security companies
- The fees were last changed in 2011, no longer covered the program administration costs: Forecasted revenue shortfall in the 2021-23 biennium
- Effective November 1st, 2022, the fee increase was approved by the Board, PSPIC, and DAS
