Subject: HB 5019 - Relating to state financial administration

The -3 amendment to HB 5019 replaces the measure and appropriates \$127.9 million to the Housing and Community Services Department (\$126.3 million) and Department of Emergency Management (\$1.6 million) in total for the 2021-23 and 2023-25 biennia to support the state's response to the homelessness emergency declared in Executive Order 23-02. An additional \$27.4 million is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services Department to address homelessness in communities within the Balance of State Continuum of Care.

A total of \$25.1 million is also provided to the Housing and Community Services Department (\$5.2 million) and Department of Human Services (\$19.9 million) to expand programs and services for youth experiencing homelessness.

General Fund in the Housing and Community Services Department's 2021-23 approved budget not expected to be expended by the end of the biennium is reduced by \$30.6 million and repurposed for the state's homelessness emergency. The measure has an emergency clause and is effective on passage.

§12 Housing and Community Services Department	Provides \$1.25 million in the 2023-25 biennium for administration of support provided to address homelessness in communities within the OR-505 - Oregon Balance of State Continuum of Care. Of the \$30 million appropriated for the program in HB 5006 (2021), \$16.6 million remains unspent.	(\$16,623,741) General Fund

## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 5019

1 Delete lines 4 through 15 of the printed bill and insert:

<u>"SECTION 1.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services
Department, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General
Fund, the amount of \$7,386,826 for homelessness prevention services
delivered through the Oregon Eviction Diversion and Prevention and
Eviction Prevention Rapid Response programs.

8 "SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-9 ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services 10 Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the Gen-11 eral Fund, the amount of \$26,213,174 for homelessness prevention ser-12 vices delivered through the Oregon Eviction Diversion and Prevention 13 and Eviction Prevention Rapid Response programs.

"SECTION 3. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services Department, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$200,000 for the development and design of a statewide, long-term rent assistance program for individuals who are rehoused with state investments made by sections 4 and 5 of this 2023 Act.

ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services Department, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$20,900,000 to increase shelter capacity and connections to shelter, support rapid rehousing initiatives, provide capacity support for culturally responsive organizations and provide sanitation services for communities in designated homelessness emergency areas, based on local plans submitted to the department.

"SECTION 5. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-8 ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services 9 Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the Gen-10 eral Fund, the amount of \$64,300,000 to increase shelter capacity and 11 connections to shelter, support rapid rehousing initiatives, provide 12 capacity support for culturally responsive organizations and provide 13 sanitation services for communities in designated homelessness emer-14 gency areas, based on local plans submitted to the department. 15

"SECTION 6. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-16 ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services 17 Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the Gen-18 eral Fund, the amount of \$5,000,000 to provide support to members of 19 recognized Indian tribes federally in Oregon experiencing 20homelessness. 21

"SECTION 7. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-22ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services 23Department, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General 24Fund, the amount of \$1,125,824 for the administration of homelessness 25prevention programs and local plans addressing unsheltered 26homelessness in designated homelessness emergency areas. 27

"<u>SECTION 8.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services
 Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the Gen-

eral Fund, the amount of \$1,145,303 for the administration of
 homelessness prevention programs and local plans addressing unshel tered homelessness in designated homelessness emergency areas.

"SECTION 9. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Department of Emergency Management, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$923,925 for the coordination of efforts to address homelessness in designated homelessness emergency areas as part of the activation of the State of Oregon Emergency Operations Plan.

"SECTION 10. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Department of Emergency Management, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$722,631 for the coordination of efforts to address homelessness in designated homelessness emergency areas as part of the activation of the State of Oregon Emergency Operations Plan.

"SECTION 11. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-18 ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services 19 Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the Gen-20eral Fund, the amount of \$26,135,000 to increase shelter capacity and 21connections to shelter, support rapid rehousing initiatives, provide 22capacity support for culturally responsive organizations and provide 23sanitation services for communities within the OR-505 - Oregon Bal-24ance of State Continuum of Care. 25

26 "<u>SECTION 12.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-27 ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services 28 Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the Gen-29 eral Fund, the amount of \$1,250,000 for the administration of support 30 provided to address homelessness in communities within the OR-505 - **1 Oregon Balance of State Continuum of Care.** 

"SECTION 13. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri- $\mathbf{2}$ ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services 3 Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the Gen-4 eral Fund, the amount of \$5,000,000 for deposit into the Emergency  $\mathbf{5}$ Housing Account created under ORS 458.620, for the purpose of pro-6 viding services and assistance to school-aged children enrolled in 7 kindergarten through grade 12 who are homeless or at risk of becom-8 ing homeless, or their families. 9

"SECTION 14. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, 10 the amount of \$5,000,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 11 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Housing 12 and Community Services Department from the Emergency Housing 13 Account created under ORS 458.620 for the purpose of providing ser-14 vices and assistance to school-aged children enrolled in kindergarten 15through grade 12 who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless, 16 or their families. 17

18 "SECTION 15. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-19 ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services 20 Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the Gen-21 eral Fund, the amount of \$200,854, for administration of the provision 22 of services and assistance to school-aged children enrolled in 23 kindergarten through grade 12 who are homeless or at risk of becom-24 ing homeless, or their families.

<sup>25</sup> "<u>SECTION 16.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-<sup>26</sup> ation, there is appropriated to the Department of Human Services, for <sup>27</sup> the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the General Fund, the <sup>28</sup> amount of \$12,500,000 for the purpose of awarding grants to increase <sup>29</sup> access by youth experiencing homelessness to shelter facilities, out-<sup>30</sup> reach, culturally specific services and mental health or substance abuse services and to strengthen partnerships with host home programs and other transitional housing options.

SECTION 17. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Department of Human Services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$6,250,000 for the purpose of providing two-year grants to organizations operating host home projects to establish, continue or expand operation of host home projects for youth experiencing homelessness.

<sup>10</sup> "<u>SECTION 18.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-<sup>11</sup> ation, there is appropriated to the Department of Human Services, for <sup>12</sup> the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the General Fund, the <sup>13</sup> amount of \$1,171,469, for the administration of programs and services <sup>14</sup> for youth experiencing homelessness.

15 "SECTION 19. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the 16 General Fund appropriation made to the Housing and Community 17 Services Department by section 229, chapter 669, Oregon Laws 2021, for 18 the biennium ending June 30, 2023, for distributions to compensate 19 landlords for unpaid rent payments pursuant to sections 12 and 13, 20 chapter 420, Oregon Laws 2021, is decreased by \$16,623,741.

"<u>SECTION 20.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
 General Fund appropriation made to the Housing and Community
 Services Department by section 1, chapter 556, Oregon Laws 2021, for
 the biennium ending June 30, 2023, is decreased by \$14,000,000.

25 "<u>SECTION 21.</u> This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate
26 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
27 declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect on its passage.".
